The position is assigned to the Junior Professorship for Social Geography (Prof. Dr. Simon Runkel). The research of the workgroup Social Geography is interested in current aspects of societal, demographic and global change from a spatial perspective. The position is part of a new international research project funded by the Deutsche Forschungsgemeinschaft (DFG) titled "Atmospheres of (Counter)Terror in European Cities" (2021–2023). The aim of the project is to identify and explore the felt and emotive dimensions of contemporary terror threats and counterterrorism measures as they play out in the ordinary experiences of urban populations. The theoretical framework of the projects draws on current sociological and geographical theories (theories on affective atmospheres, non-representational theories, crowd theories etc.). Empirically, qualitative and ethnographic methods will be deployed in field research in European cities.

Your responsibilities:

- Conducting empirical social research within the context of the project in all research phases (planning, preparation, implementation, analysis) and research data management
- Project communication with international partners in various European countries and the organization of international meetings, workshops and conferences
- Publication and dissemination of research results
- Opportunity for doctoral qualification will be given

Requirements:

- Qualified university degree (Master) in (Human) Geography or in a related discipline with a high affinity to social theories
- Excellent knowledge of current debates and theories in human geography, sociology and political sciences
- Verifiable knowledge on empirical social or ethnographic research methods
- Excellent English communication skills (both written and spoken), very good German skills (both written and spoken), French communication skills will be an asset
